- Approx Op Surplus, ~\$180k
  - Hoping to withdraw \$3.5k to match donations to Various BLM organizations and donating to the BLM Toronto Chapter

- Matching donations until Oct. 1st
- Emergency fund is \$10k, the \$3.5k will be moved into here
